3.20 No. of Research scholars receiving the Fellowships (Newly enrolled + existing ones)

Students Literary Society and NSS unit of the College launched *Swachha Bharat Abhiyan* (Clean India Programme) on 21.10.2014. A large number of students of the college participated in the programme. This cleanliness drive was organized within the college campus as a starter. The college has its plan to organise such programme on larger scale outside the campus in near future.

The 33^{rd} Ishwan Mwshahary Memorial Day was observed at Kokrajhar Govt. College with a three-day long colourful programme on $28^{th} - 30^{th}$ October 2014. The programme was jointly organized by the Department of Bodo and Kokrajhar Govt. College Bodo Students' Literary Society. The programme was enlivened by organising various literary, academic and cultural competitions like Literary writing competition poem recitation, debate, quiz, drama, extempore speech, folk song and folk dance, group discussion etc.

The Kokrajhar Govt. College Students' Union in association with Central Institute of Technology Kokrajhar, and "SPIC-MACAY", organized a workshop on 08.11.2014 at the College premises, to provide classical dance training for the students of the college.

A free health check-up programme was organized on 14.11.2014 in the college premises for students, teachers and employees of the college. On the request of the college RNB Civil Hospital, Kokrajhar deputed doctors, pharmacist and two assistants to perform the programme.

World Society of Mathematical Sciences (WSMS), an organisation led by the Department of Mathematics, Kokrajhar Govt. College, celebrated international year of crystallography by organising different competitions. A quiz competition on Science and technology was organised by it on 23rd November 2014 involving participants from different institutions of Kokrajhar. On 11.11.2014 the society organised a talk on "*India's Mars Mission*" for Science students of the college to create awareness about India's Space research programme.

The extension education services cell of the College observed the World AIDS Day in the college on 01.12.2014. In connection with the programme, a meeting session with students and teachers was organized in the Old Science Gallery.

The Kokrajhar Govt. College Teachers Association, Students Union and Women cell distributed relief materials, as a gesture of humanitarian service, on 06.01.2015, among the inmates of five (5) relief camps of Saralpara & Ultapani which were instituted by the government for the displaced people in the ethnic clash that took place in the last week of December 2014.

The college organized a competition programme and a seminar on "Biodiversity and Climate Change" on 21.01.2015 under a DST sponsored and ASTEC conducted Project, inviting students from different schools of the district. Around 260 Participants from 13 institutions took part in the sensitization programme. Spot essay writing, extempore speech, poster making competition etc. were conducted.

The Women Cell, Kokrajhar Govt. College, celebrated the International Women's Day by arranging an awareness programme on education and health and hygiene at Rainadabri village in Kokrajhar District on 08.03.2015 in which a free medical check up was organized as a part of the programme. Dr. Manisha Boro Phukan (Gynaecologist) and Dr. Rajib Basumatary (Dentist) rendered their valuable service to the poor village people on that day. Three cartons of medicines, provided by Deputy Director, NRHM, Kokrajhar, were distributed among the villagers.

The Department of History, in collaboration with the IQAC of the college, organized awareness programme on historically important places in Kokrajhar area on 30.03.2015. The programme was arranged at *Onthaigwlao*, *Elachijhar*, about 3 Kilometers from Kokrajhar town. The place itself has some historical background which has not been studied yet.

The extension education services cell of the College, in collaboration with the IQAC and the Department of Chemistry, organized an awareness programme at Harinaguri High School (Baokhungri) on the topic "Pure and Safe Drinking Water for Good Health" on 08.05.2015 for the benefit of the people of Harinaguri area as the area has water related problem.

A one week awareness programme on the importance of Yoga was organized by the 7th Assam Bn NCC, Dhubri, at Kokrajhar Govt. College under the leadership of ANO Dr. Bimal Kanti Basumatary from 22nd to 28th April 2015 on the college premises.

The IQAC of the college organized a skill development programme in the college on 10.05.2015. The training was organized to update the knowledge and skill of non-teaching staff of the college. Apart from Kokrajhar College, participants of other colleges also joined the programme

The Department of Bodo, in collaboration with Bodo Department Teachers' Association, Kokrajhar Govt. College, Kokrajhar, celebrated the 73rd Birthday of the living literary legend Shri Brajendra Kumar Brahma, ex-president, Bodo Sahitya Sabha, on 01.06.2015.

The College under the initiative of NCC observed International Yoga Day on 21.06.2015 wherein about 100 students participated.

The IQAC arranged for the Adoption of Schools by Kokrajhar Govt. College. In this regard, two remotely situated LP Schools (No. 237 Boro Nalbari LP School and Dhopguri Rabhapara LP School) were formally adopted by Kokrajhar Govt. College on 29.06.2015 in consultation with the School Authorities and the concerned department.

6. Governance, Leadership and Management

6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution

Vision of the college:

To transform the college into a centre of excellence by way of quality education for the promotion and development of a progressive civil society.

6.2 Does the Institution has a Management Information System

The college does not have open Management Information System. The student related information such as monthly class attendance, marks obtained in the unit test/sessional examinations etc. are displayed on the college notice board.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The College is affiliated to Gauhati University and follows the curriculum prepared/developed by the University. However, faculty members, especially from the department of Bodo, contribute their bits to the curriculum and syllabi development of the university as and when required by the affiliating as well as neighbouring universities.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

The college prepares an academic calendar at the beginning of each academic session along with teaching plans prepared by the individual departments. The teaching plan is executed with the closest affinity to the academic calendar and is recorded in the teaching execution register departmentally and individually. Utmost efforts are made to make the teaching process more learner-centric. The progress of students is continuously tested and evaluated through Class Tests, Sessional Examinations, Viva, Projects, study tour, field study, seminar, group discussion, class assignment etc. to garner extra points in internal assessment. Weak students are always encouraged to join remedial classes / tutorials. Feedback forms are generated so as to continually evaluate the performance of the teachers.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

The examinations for written external papers and internal and practical parts are conducted as per the guidelines set by the affiliating university. The college enjoys fame for conduction of free and fair examinations. More often than not, the college is selected as an evaluation zone and hence, most of the teachers are engaged as zonal officers, head examiners, examiners and scrutinizers. Further, teachers of the institution participate in such activities in other evaluation zones. The process followed in evaluation is the same as desired by the university.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The faculty members carry on their MRPs utilising departmental laboratories as and when required. However, Dr. B.K.Brahma, Principal, Dr. Arun Kumar and Dr. S.J Wary from the Department of English and Dr. Shibu Basak from the Department of Mathematics have been selected as Research Supervisor for Ph.D scholars in Bodoland University, Kokrajhar. RUSA has been approached for setting up a joint Language Laboratory for literature departments. A research laboratory has been set up in the Chemistry Department of the college during the current session.

.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

Library: N-LIST facility has been made accessible to students in the library. Photostat facility in the library has been made available at a nominal price for students

ICT: Room No. AB1 has been renovated as a smart class room. LAN was set up in all the college computers.

Physical infrastructure:

- a) A new gate has been constructed at the Girls Hostel.
- b) Cattle bridges were constructed at both the college gates. Ramps for physically handicapped students were constructed.
- c) The College Canteen was renovated adding more facilities.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

The college is run by the joint efforts of the IQAC and the office of the Principal. The human resource is managed amicably through substitute or extra duty in case some of teaching or non-teaching staff has to be temporarily out of the college for official, administrative or academic purposes. The college has a performance evaluation system through feedback from the students and the parents. For the development of the human resource, the college encourages its faculty members to pursue academic, intellectual and research related works apart from providing computer training to teaching and non-teaching staff from time to time.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

- A) For the recruitment of teaching faculty selection is made by Assam Public Service Commission and appointment is made by the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of Assam.
- B) For appointment of Grade-III and Grade-IV staff candidates are called for interview through employment exchange, with due permission from the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of Assam. Selected candidates are appointed by the Principal and are approved by the concerned higher authority.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

Issuance of acknowledgement card to the newly admitted students:

The newly admitted students are generally unaware of the system prevailing in the college. Every year during the time of admissions to degree 1st Semester and Higher Secondary 1st Year classes, it was observed that several students misinterpreted the subject combinations allotted to them at the admission desk and as a result, they were confused about the subjects which they had taken. These students at the beginning of academic session thus remained unsure of their subjects and they had to waste their time in order to find out their subject combinations from college office. Considering all these aspects it was decided to issue an acknowledgement card on the spot in the admission hall to all the newly admitted students of the college. The acknowledgement card provided to the students contains class roll number as well as subject combinations of the students. Consequently, all the newly admitted students are now fully aware about their subject combinations and it has led to smooth functioning of classes from the beginning of academic session

During the academic year 2014-15, feedback forms were provided to 75% of the UG major course students, among which 83% submitted their responses (265out of 305), for evaluation of various academic attributes of teachers of Kokrajhar Govt. College . The formats containing 10 numbers of questions duly filled in by students were thoroughly studied by a retired faculty expert and the following report has been prepared accordingly.

- 1) Assamese Department: After assessing the Feedback reports of this Department, it can be mentioned that students are satisfied with the teaching staff of the Department for their proper guidance and help. Students of this Department are able to show their proficiency in the final year examination and they also expressed their satisfaction about healthy relationship between students and teachers. Accessibility of the teachers in and out of the class was found to be very high. The communication skills as well as interest generating skill of the teachers are found to be satisfactory.
- **2) Bodo Department:** The Feedback reports collected from the students of the Department of Bodo found to be highly satisfactory. Bodo language is the main communication language of the BTAD region; therefore the number of students is in increasing trend. Despite of heavy rush of the students in this Department the teachers are sincere, competent and committed. As a result of which good relationship between teachers and students exists and it has led to good academic atmosphere.
- **3) Department of English:** The Department of English, in terms of enrolment of students, is the largest Department of the college, having six permanent faculty members and one contractual teacher. As per the usual practice, feedbacks were collected from the 6th semester (3rd year) against each of the teachers. The analysis of the feedback forms reveals that the teachers of the Department are punctual, motivating, creative, communicative and co-operative. All of the students rated the teachers' performance and their ability to draw upon cross-textual references and design quizzes/questions as above average.
- **4) Department of Political Science:** As per feedback report received from the students of various semesters the Department was found to be satisfactory about teacher's sincerity, commitment, knowledge, accessibility, ability to integrate the course material, project etc. Overall rating of teachers is highly satisfactory.
- **5) Department of Economics:** Economics has been introduced in both Arts and Science faculties. After assessing the feedback reports of the Department, it can be mentioned that students are satisfied for their proper help and guidance in various academic activities like conducting seminars, project work etc. Above all the communicating as well as interest generating skill of the teachers is found to be satisfactory.

- 6) Department of Education: Having a large number of enrolment in the Department of Education, a good number of feedback were received from the students of the Department. From the students feedback received it can be easily assessed that the teachers of the Department are active and punctual in academic activities of the Department. Knowledge base and communication skill of all the teachers are found to be high and satisfactory.
- 7) **Department of Geography:** After assessing the feedback reports of this Department, it can be mentioned that students are highly satisfied with their teachers. Their communicating skill, while imparting quality education and providing support in various academic activities are excellent. Healthy teacher-student relationship is maintained in the Department. Teachers are easily accessible inside and outside of the class rooms.
- **8) Department of Philosophy:** The faculty members of the Department of Philosophy are found to be satisfactory as the students rated the teachers to be knowledgeable, sincere, and good in communication skill. Healthy teacher-student relationship exists in the Department.
- **9) Department of Statistics:** It has been assessed from the student's feedback that the teachers are found to be highly effective in communication skill and generating interest, project work etc. Students are satisfied about the contribution made by the teachers in the Department. However the students feel the existing laboratory facility to be inadequate.
- 10.) **Department of History**: The students feedback from the Department of history s found to be satisfactory and the students are quite happy with the teachers for the cordial relationship. Communication skill and sincerity of teachers are found to be satisfactory. Students have highly rated the teachers' ability to integrate the course materials and easy accessibility in and out of the class.
- 11) Department of Mathematics: As per feedback report it is found that teachers of this Department are able to provide quality education; Communication skill as well as ability to design examinations, assignments; projects etc were found to be satisfactory. Teachers are able to generate interest among the students about the value and importance of the subject. However, students feel inadequacy of the existing laboratory facilities.
- **12) Department of Computer Science:** As per feedback report it was reflected that the teacher-student relationship is good and congenial. There are only two teachers in the Department and are found to be competent enough in all respect of teaching and learning. According to the rating teachers are sincere, committed to all the academic activities. Further, it was reflected that knowledge and interest generating capacity are quite satisfactory.
- **13) Department of Hindi:** This is a newly established Department with a few number of students. As per reflection from the students feedback teachers are found to be highly generous and students are highly satisfied with the attribute possessed by teachers of the Department in various fields. A congenial teacher-student relationship is maintained.
- **14) Department of Bengali:** The feedback responses of the students are high and satisfactory. Students rated teachers to be effective and competent in teaching learning as well as in other activities. Further it is reflected that there is a congenial atmosphere in the Department in between teachers and students.

- **15) Department of Physics:** As per feedback overall rating of teachers are found to be efficient, knowledgeable, sincere and committed. They maintain a good healthy relationship with the students in and out of the class.
- **16) Department of Chemistry:** From the students' feedback of the Department, it is found that students are highly satisfied with the teachers, in their guidance and help in various allotted works of the Department. Students are happy regarding teacher-students relationship. Sincerity and commitment, communication skill etc. of the teachers is found to be satisfactory. Teachers are very helpful in preparing projects /assignments/seminars etc.
- **17) Department of Zoology:** As per the feedback report received from the Department of Zoology, teachers are rated as active, punctual, sincere and committed. Teachers are honestly dedicative to all academic activities. Communication skill and teacher-student relationship is found to be satisfactory.
- **18) Department of Botany:** As per the feedback report received from the Department of Botany, the teachers are found to be satisfactory in all respects of departmental works. Students of this Department are satisfied about the performance, sincerity and overall attribution of the teachers towards the attainment of academic excellence. Both students and teachers of the Department maintain a healthy atmosphere in their relationship .The overall rating of the students in this Department towards the teachers is highly satisfactory.

Conclusion: The academic atmosphere of the college is congenial to both students and teachers. It can be mentioned that students are satisfied with modern facilities of equipments that has been set up especially in the science laboratories for their experimental works. Further, students are highly satisfied with power point presentation /lectures that have been continuing in the some of the Departments. Since students from many ethnic groups of are admitted in Kokrajhar Govt. College a Language Laboratory is highly essential for the study of the characteristics of different languages available in the college.

1. Title of the practice: Computerised Data Enquiry system for students

2. Goal:

- a) To assist the Students regarding any query about their subject combination, Class Roll Number, University Roll Number, Examination related data etc.
- b) To maintain database of any student till he/she completes the entire course of study.
- c) To prepare error free attendance registers.

3. The Context:

With the introduction of semester system in undergraduate course by Gauhati University during the session 2011-12 it was found that a large volume of data had to be preserved manually for each student and at the end of each semester data renewal was necessary. Moreover it was a little difficult and time consuming to provide reply regarding queries like subject combination, Class Roll Number, University Roll Number, Examination related data etc. from manual records. Again, hand written students' attendance registers very often had erroneous names and inappropriate subjects. Considering all these aspects in 2014-15 it was decided to create a Computerised Data Enquiry system for students.

4. The Practice:

Every year, the admission committee, after being formed, nominates one or two members from the committee (who are faculties of the college) to supervise the data entry during the admission process. Once the admission forms are verified at the help desk, the data corresponding to different fields of admission form like candidates name, address, parents name entered in office computer. On the day of admission the data regarding subject combinations, class roll number etc are entered on the spot in the admission hall completing the entire database of the student. This data can be further used for any query about their subject combination, Class Roll Number, University Roll Number, Examination related data and preparation of student's attendance registers.

5. Evidence of Success:

The system has been able to assist the students regarding any query about their subject combination, Class Roll Number University Roll Number, Examination related data etc. The college can easily maintain database of any student till he/she completes the entire course of study due to this system. Moreover error free student attendance registers have been prepared from this data.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

- a) Lack of skilled office staff to maintain the system
- b) Admission data management software developed by the Computer Science department of the College is needed to be upgraded, else effective software from the professional developers need to be purchased. During the current year data are managed in Microsoft excel sheets.
- **7. Notes:** In future the College will need more computers and trained personnel for smooth running of the Computerised Data Enquiry system for students.

1. Title of the Practice: Training of Assamese language for faculties who do not have sound knowledge of Assamese.

2. Goal:

To teach state language Assamese to the faculties, in order to help them in effective comprehension of terminologies in their respective subject. The knowledge of Assamese will also facilitate the evaluation of answer scripts written in Assamese.

3. The Context:

Although English is the medium of instruction of the college, faculty members are required to evaluate answer scripts from different institutions written in Assamese. Knowledge of the language also become helpful for the teachers in explaining certain terms easily understood by the students when translated into Bodo and Assamese. As the college had already run Certificate Course in Bodo, this course on Assamese was felt to be urgent by many faculty members who do not have a sound background in Assamese language.

4. The Practice:

A free training has been conducted for one month taking six days a week classes. The programme was designed by the Assamese Department of the College. The classes are stared with alphabet, vocabulary, knowledge of grammar and spoken Assamese language. At the end of the programme, the evaluation of learners is done in writing and viva-voce.

5. Evidence of Success:

- a) Seventy percent of the trainees have expressed confidence in using the Assamese language for effective communication and evaluation of answer scripts.
- b) It is observed during the last part of the classes that trainees could be able to express their queries in this language.
- c) Some trainees who have been working in the other language departments of the college like Bodo and English are highly benefitted, as they have expressed that they became capable of working in language related research including Assamese language.

6. Problems encountered and resources required:

- i. The number of resource persons are limited.
- ii. Insufficient study materials.
- iii. Financial constraints
- iv. Problems in management of time during class hours.

7. Notes:

To continue this type of effective programme in the coming years co-operations from the college administration, local government, and most importantly, the response from the other language speaking people is required.
