REPORT

An online three days' workshop was organized jointly by the Post Graduate Departments, Chemistry and Mathematics, of Kokrajhar Govt. College, Kokrajhar, from 28th to 30th June 2021 on the topic "Efficient Use of Microsoft Word in Thesis Writings" targeting the research scholars of all the disciplines who use Microsoft Word in compiling their theses and papers. The workshop was convened by Dr. Shibu Basak, Vice-Principal and Head of the Department of Mathematics and he was assisted by Dr. Basanta Kr. Das, Associate Professor and Head of the Department of Chemistry, as the Joint Convenor. Mr. Leeladhar Chouhan, Assistant Professor of the Department of Physics, assisted as the Moderator for the whole programme from beginning to ending very meticulously and sincerely without leaving any room for a complaint from any of the participants.
