<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students' assessment of the department in connection with the laboratory facilities, effectiveness, punctuality, syllabus coverage etc of the teachers and (Student satisfaction survey, SSS), and their assessment of the course materials in connection with the usefulness of the course (Structure feedback analysis). The SSS contains different questions on academic aspects in terms of departmental teachers' grading by the students on a scale of 5(five) points related with the teachers' performance in the classroom. The assessment includes the teachers' helpfulness, mentorship and motivational attitude. Teachers of the departments are assessed by the students as Excellent, Very Good, Good, Average, and Poor. The IQAC forms an analysis committee to analyse the data obtained, The numerical data obtained from the assessment form is typed in MS excel and plotted in bar diagram by using Origin Lab software. The feedbacks are analyzed statistically and different criteria are compared and contrasted with the help of bar diagram. Thereafter, a report is prepared by the Feedback analysis committee which is submitted to IQAC. Feedback from the teachers is collected through the meetings of Academic Council, Kokrajhar Govt. College Teachers Association, General Meeting of IQAC etc. The college also gathers feedback from employers in the meeting of Board of Governors. Feedback from the alumni is collected during alumni meetings. Feedback from parents are acquired through Annual Guardians Meet.

Providing a reliable and comprehensive support system to motivate students to excel in both academic and non-academic fields.. ? To enhance students' attendance and minimise student drop-out rates. ? To identify and understand the status of slow learners and encourage advanced learners. ? To render equitable service to students ? To proactively try to identify problems of the general student populace and to bring them to the notice of the concerned authorities. ? To help undergraduate fresh students understand the challenges and opportunities present in the Institute and develop a smooth transition to campus life. Implementation of Student Mentoring system: The implementation of the programme will be in following phases: Phase I: Selecting Faculty mentors. Phase II: Allotment of students to the mentors. Phase III: Interaction of students with the mentors and identifying strengths and weaknesses of the mentees. Forming Whatsapp group, if needed, to keep contact among the group. Phase IV: Periodic meeting of the mentees with the mentors. Phase V: Obtaining feedback from the mentees at the end of the session. Structure of the Mentoring System: This programme primarily deals with all the undergraduate and postgraduate students of our College and all full time teachers will perform their duty as mentors. Role of Faculty Mentor (FM) : The FM will perform the following duties. ? Meet their group of students at least twice in each semester. ? Continuously monitor, counsel, guide and motivate the students in all academic matters and if a student is identified as having weakness in particular subject, the Mentor will apprise the matter to the concerned faculty/HoD. ? Maintain a

detail progressive record of the student. ? Advise students in their career development guidance. ? Contact parents/guardians if situation demands e.g. academic irregularities, detrimental activities etc. and arrange special meetings with the Principal if required ? Maintain records of all discussions with students. ? Play major role to enhance participation of Parents/Guardians in Guardian meets arranged by the College.

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2.5.2 – Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)

As part of sound educational strategy, the institution adopts centralized

Continuous Internal Evaluation System (CIES) to assess all aspects of a student's development on a continuous basis throughout the year. This is executed by examination cell in collaboration with Academic Council.

- Orientation on Evaluation Process: Students are made aware of the evaluation process by notification. Academic Calendar has Internal Exam (Sessional Exam) dates. Internal Examination marks are displayed on the Notice Board of the respective departments.
- Result Analysis Review Meeting: Result Analysis is done by the Result Analysis Committee after every academic year. Pass percentage of each course is calculated by dividing the total number of students appeared and passed in each course. The performance of the students is monitored by the IQAC, Principal and Academic council and necessary feedback is given to the concerned faculty members. The Principal conducts Review Meetings department wise, to give necessary feedback for the improvement of students' performance.
- External Examinations are conducted at the end of every semester for all the theory papers and practical papers: Students should satisfy the eligibility criteria of 75 percent attendance in each semester to appear for University Examination. The students who have arrears are permitted to write their arrear papers along with regular semester examinations.
- Reappearing/Recounting/Revaluation: The students are informed of the Reappearing/Recounting/Revaluation option available to them, regarding their examinations. Students who fail in Sessional Examinations are given a chance to appear for the same examination again conducted by the concerned department

2.5.3 – Academic calendar prepared and adhered for conduct of Examination and other related matters (250 words)

The Academic Calendar committee prepared the Academic Calendar for the academic year 2019-20, following the publication of Academic calendar for Undergraduate Courses by Gauhati University. The calendar contained important information like a) schedule of admission into the College b) filling up of registration forms c) commencement of daily classes d) examination schedules for both sessional/unit tests as well as final examinations conducted by the college, university and Assam Higher Secondary Education Council e) other important college events f)holidays and working days for the session. Most of the events in the academic session 2019-20 went as per the academic calendar with the following exceptions: All the normal classes remained suspended from 24th March due to nationwide lockdown. All the Sessional Examination of the even semesters 2020 had to postponed indefinitely due to Covid-19 pandemic. No End semester Examinations were conducted till June, 2020 due to Covid-19 pandemic. Departmental seminars and Sessional Examinations were conducted online due to Covid-19 pandemic from the month of May, 2020. Individual departments took online classes from the month of April and completed their syllabi by June.

The final decision in the meeting is taken in consultation with the HoDs. • The examinations are carried out periodically throughout the year for which there is a separate examination cell comprising of faculties as Assistant Officer in Charges and office staffs for carrying out different examination related works. The Vice- Principal of the college is in charge of Examination Cell. The Cell conducts regular meetings, also attended by the Principal. • The existence of the Academic Council in the College is another instance of decentralization and participative management. The Academic Council, within the academic spheres of the college, is the supreme academic body that looks after the academic health of the institution. Consisting of the Principal as the ex-officio chairperson, the Vice-Principal as the ex-officio convenor and all the HoDs as the ex-officio members in different portfolios, the Council sits for meeting regularly to discuss, regulate and resolve matters dealing with teaching and learning in the college.

7.2.1 – Describe at least two institutional best practices

A. Online admission System for Undergraduate Students

1. Title of the practice : Online admission System for Undergraduate Students
2. Objectives of the Practice:
 - a) To give applicants freedom to submit their applications at their convenience.
 - b) To contribute towards sustainable development by reducing paper wastage.
 - c) To develop a highly reliable and efficient system by reducing paperwork errors (which used to creep in despite precautions in offline system).
 - d) To obtain customizable real time reports of applicants for smooth processing of admission
 - e) To increase transparency in processes and overall activities of admission.
 - f) To create database of any student till he/she completes the entire course of study.
 - g) To facilitate Digital India Mission.
3. The Context: It has been noticed by the college authority that the number of students applying for admission in the college is increasing every year. Additionally, the student's admission process is getting increasingly complex with interested learners applying from different geographical locations, applying for a myriad combination of subjects, applying using various discounts and scholarships etc. In this scenario it is fast becoming increasingly difficult to handle such a large volume of student's admission in the traditional methods. Thus, there is an increasing need for using technology and adapting to an online admission management system for Kokrajhar Govt College also. During the academic year 2017-18 software from professional developers was purchased to create a "Data Management System for Students". This software

was trialled for Online Admission form submission system but could not be upgraded properly by its developers to handle Online Admission system and hence it was discarded. In this academic year fresh software was subscribed to facilitate "Online admission System for Undergraduate and HS Students" 4. The Practice: In the college website <https://www.kgc.edu.in/> an admission registration URL was provided for online applicants. The applicants could register by using his/her mobile number and email address on the above mentioned link. On successful registration an applicant could apply for admission by filling the admission form online and uploading desired scanned copies of documents. The software was preloaded with the eligibility criteria and cut off marks so that only eligible students could apply. After successful submission of the online admission form the applicant printed the copy of the filled form and submitted to college office along with the fee for college prospectus. The selection list of eligible candidates was prepared by the admission committee on the basis of list of candidates obtained from the software. During admission the hard copies of original documents of selected candidates were verified on the spot by using the software on real time basis without downloading documents. The desired subjects of the selected candidate on the basis of merit were entered by the admission committee on the spot in the software and a system generated admission receipt was generated along with class roll number completing the admission process. 5. Evidence of Success : a) This year students using internet connectivity could submit their applications at the click of a mouse at their convenience. b) The admission committee was able to filter out candidates and process the applications in a quick time for preparing selection list. c) There are high fatigue and monotony involved in the form verification of the admission process and this can be a catalyst for errors. This time human errors were minimized as the form was filled online by the candidate. d) The admission process was hassle free with less men power being involved. Thus, it was cost effective too. e) The collection of admission fee and processing of students fee records was streamlined by the online system. This in turn helped to prepare fee waiver database of fee waived students smoothly. f) The college got access to student records and databases which was used to prepare error-free student attendance registers in quick time. The data of admitted candidates was saved in office records for further requirements. 6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required a) Proper training to use all the features of the software is yet to be imparted to office staff. b) This year online fee payment was not integrated to the admission software but it is expected to be done in next academic session. b) Up gradation of the software is required to create a Management Information System for office. c) Students of rural areas with poor net connectivity had to travel to town for online form submission. 7. Notes: In future the College can provide facility of online admission form submission at its own computer centre at a fee much lower than the fee charged by internet-cafe shops. In particular, this move will help the poor rural students. This facility may also generate revenue for the subscription fee of the software. B. Adoption of Tribal Village for Development: 1. Title of the practice: Adoption of Tribal Village for Development: 2. Objectives of the Practice: I. To assure education to the children and conduct medical camps II. To assure livelihood training for self-sustenance. III. To assure conservation of indigenous species of flora and fauna. 3. The context The Co-Ordinator of Internal Quality Assurance Cell of Kokrajhar Govt. College had the chance to visit the tribal village Bandugwri, which is a village near the Chakrasila Wildlife Sanctuary, famous for its conservation of Golden Langur. The Co-Ordinator was dismayed to see that the most of the villagers were living below poverty line which effected the literacy rate of the village. As the village is situated within the periphery of Chakrasila Wildlife Sanctuary which is rich with valuable indigenous species of flora and fauna, it was observed, mindless destruction of adjacent forest to harness the indigenous flora. After interacting with the villagers, the Co-Ordinator came to know that

village had unemployment issues. As the village was in close proximity of the college, it was decided to adopt the village and conduct regular awareness programmes, interaction with the villagers, and health camps. 4. The Practice: It was resolved that here were three major areas to focus on---i) health and education for children, ii) livelihood training for self-sustenance, iii) conservation of indigenous species of flora and fauna. Awareness camps were conducted regularly in the village to provide them with the benefits of Vaccination programmes conducted by the Govt. Vaccination camp and awareness programmes for COVID-19 was also conducted in the village in collaboration with Nation Health Mission, Kokrajhar Circle, to help curb the spread of Covid-19 pandemic. The faculty and the PG students of the college through their Extension Services Cell conducted series of classes to help the children of the village to overcome the shortage of teachers in the adopted school and also encourage the dropout students to continue their studies. The village had huge areas where cultivation was done for only one season and the villagers did not have the knowledge of crop rotation which naturally helps to maintain the fertility of the cultivable land. Further to make the villagers self-sustaining, livelihood programmes were conducted, especially in the area of mushroom cultivation and pisciculture. The college took the help from the resource persons provided by the Department of Pisciculture, BTC, and DICC, Kokrajhar to encourage the villagers and show them new avenue of livelihood. As the village lies adjacent to Chakrasila Wildlife Sanctuary which is rich with valuable indigenous species of flora and fauna, it was observed that there was reckless use of these indigenous flora and fauna. The villagers were not aware about the importance of conservation of these indigenous resource and how it will adversely affect the ecology of the area. The college took the initiative to help conserve the resource by bringing awareness amongst the villagers and the importance of its preservation. 5. Impact of the practice: There is a sense of awareness amongst the villagers about the importance regarding the preservation of the indigenous flora and fauna. There is also a sense of realisation amongst the villagers, the importance of medical treatment rather than relying on superstition. The parents are willing to send their children to school and are open to the concept of vaccination. The youths of the villagers are earning profits from the mushroom cultivation and fishery and are also open to the crop rotation rather relying on single crop cultivation. 6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required It took daunting effort to persuade the villagers to the concept of vaccination, who are rather superstitious and very skeptical towards the terminology of vaccination. The college had to do door to door campaign in the village to persuade them to take medical help rather than to take the help of the local witch doctors. It was also difficult to persuade the villagers to cultivate indigenous flora in their own courtyard, who were accustomed to venture in the forest to collect it. The college managed the funds to conduct all the activities in the adopted village without external help, which was the main hurdle in completing the tasks taken up by the college.
